Purpose: The GlaxoSmithKline IMPACT Awards acknowledge, highlight, and reward excellence in the nonprofit healthcare community. They focus attention on nonprofit organizations that have a significant impact in their communities' access to healthcare and are capable, proactive, committed, and effective in their work. The Awards are designed to recognize success and achievements for existing overall work; you do not need to present a new program/project. Awards are bestowed upon organizations and not specific programs. The Awards may be spent at the discretion of the winning organizations but may not be used for debt reduction.

The individuals who complete the application on behalf of the nonprofit must be particularly knowledgeable about the complexities and challenges of access to healthcare in their communities and about their organization's related accomplishments.

The GlaxoSmithKline IMPACT Awards provide recognition and support for innovative programming and provide an opportunity to share successes among recipients in related fields, as well as with policy makers and the public.

The GlaxoSmithKline IMPACT Awards will be presented at a ceremony in the last quarter 2010.

The GlaxoSmithKline IMPACT Awards program has been in the Greater Philadelphia Region and in the United Kingdom for the past 13 years.

Previous award winners included nonprofits that provide

- medical and dental care for the underserved and minorities
- services for cancer patients
- access to care for chronic illness
- services for children with genetic disorders

Eligibility and Criteria: The GlaxoSmithKline IMPACT Awards are bestowed upon winning organizations for their current, overall work and not specific programs/projects. To be eligible, organizations must meet the following conditions:

- Have an IRS letter of determination verifying 501(c)(3) status as an independent entity (not part of a larger organization such as a university or hospital). This means the organization must be a separate nonprofit entity as designated by their IRS letter of determination. The name of the organization applying must have been on the IRS 501(c)(3) letter of determination for a minimum of five years.
- Have annual total operating expenses between \$160,000 and \$3 million, as documented in its most recent fiscal year financial statement.
- Be located in Chatham, Durham, Franklin, Harnett, Johnston, Orange, Person or Wake Counties.
- Have access to healthcare as its primary focus and mission (not human services), e.g., medical, dental, and mental healthcare are eligible services. Food, shelter, clothing, and transportation are human services and as such organizations providing access to human services as their primary mission are not eligible.
- Have not been a previous GlaxoSmithKline IMPACT Award Winner.
